I am a Senior Project Specialist with JLA Architects, and I have worked with Miranda Morton in her role as an Architectural Intern since her hiring in September 2022. I have worked alongside Miranda on projects such as Station 955, a 258-unit student housing project for the University of Wisconsin in Eau Claire, WI and I have managed Miranda as a Project Captain on projects such as The Hangar, a 259-unit apartment complex in Denver, CO. I was also able to serve in a mentorship role to Miranda, and I am pleased to provide this recommendation for her.

While attending the University of Colorado – Denver in pursuit of her Architectural degree, Miranda Morton worked with us as an Architectural Intern performing several of the same duties as our regular project team staff and as such was a valued member of our production team. Miranda's willingness to learn and apply newly developed skills enabled her to go from a beginning Revit user to an intermediate / almost advanced Revit user.
